

Victorian ALP 2018 Platform

July 2018

On Wednesday 25 July 2018 the Victorian Branch of the Australian Labor Party released its 2018 Platform.

The 2018 Platform is the outcome of three years of consultation and research by the Victorian Branch's policy committees and the Platform Committee, chaired by Member for Dandenong Gabrielle Williams MP.

The document sets the policy framework which will underpin the policy commitments to be made by the Andrews Labor Government in the lead-up to the 2018 Victorian State Election. It represents the views of the Party's policy committees, rank and file members and affiliates.

The Platform outlines the Party's policy agenda in the following areas:

- Jobs;
- Education;
- Health and Human Services;
- Transport;
- A Safe and Fair Community;
- Livable Communities; and
- Sustainable Communities.

Each chapter provides an overview of key issues and the directions Labor will take in responding to identified policy areas.

It is important to note the distinction between the 2018 Platform document and the fully-costed and funded commitments the Andrews Government will announce prior to the November 24 State Election. Individual policy commitments can be expected to be consistent with the values and objectives outlined in the Platform document.
