

2021 Perth and Peel Interim Restrictions

April 2021

On 26 April 2021, Western Australian Premier Mark McGowan announced four days of interim COVID-19 restrictions following the end of the three-day lockdown in the Perth and Peel regions.

The decision to end the lockdown is due to zero cases of community transmission, 29 963 tests being conducted and promising results from the testing of close and casual contacts of the earlier community case.

Interim Restrictions

From 12:01am Tuesday to 12:01am Saturday, the following restrictions are in place for the Perth and Peel regions:

Freedom of Movement

- Residents from the Perth and Peel regions may leave their homes. These residents can travel outside of these regions but must wear a mask.
- Mask wearing remains mandatory indoors, outdoors and on public transport. This is except for vigorous exercise, primary school children or those with medical exemption.
- People may return to work but working from home is encouraged if possible.
- There is a limit of 20 people in all homes and at private indoor and outdoor gatherings.
- Visits to hospitals, aged care and disability care facilities are restricted to compassionate grounds.

Venue Openings

- Both primary and secondary schools will reopen with secondary school students required to wear masks. Teaching staff at both primary and secondary schools must wear masks but are permitted to remove their masks while teaching.
- TAFE will reopen as normal.
- Universities will continue to allow online learning only.
- All public venues except casinos, nightclubs and indoor fitness centres may reopen.
- Hospitality venues (cafes, restaurants, pubs) may only provide seated service following the four-square metre rule.
- Weddings and funerals are still permitted to 100 attendees.
- Community sport will reopen for players and officials. Supporters are not permitted.
