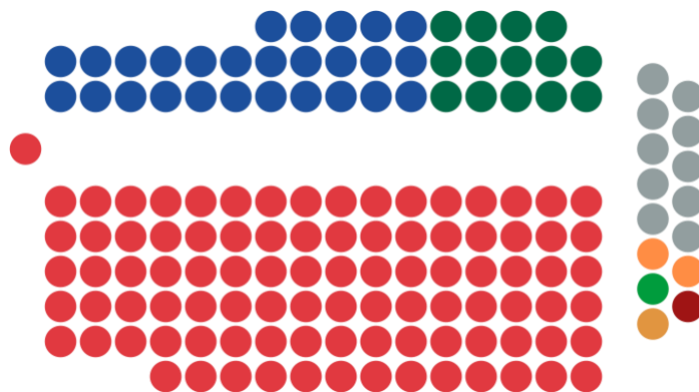
The current composition of the Australian Parliament as of 14/06/2025.

House of Representatives

There are 150 seats in the House of Representatives, known as the lower house, with a party requiring the confidence of 76 seats to govern. The seats in the lower house is proportionality representative of population.

The information above includes the following changes:

- On 27 November 2025, the Hon. Barnaby Joyce MP, Member for New England, resigned from the National Party. On 08 December 2025, Joyce formally joined One Nation.
- On 27 February 2026, the Hon. Sussan Ley MP, Member for Farrer and former Leader of the Opposition, announced her resignation from Parliament.

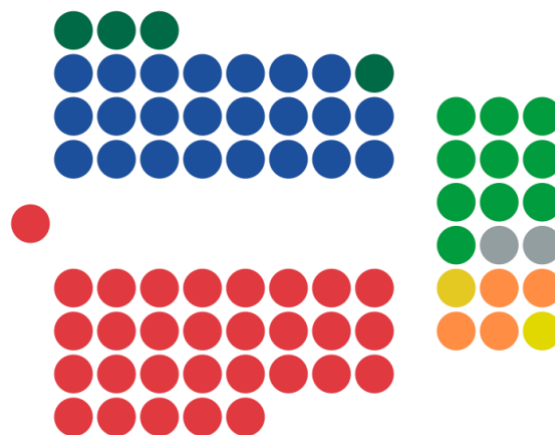
- On 09 May 2026, David Farley was elected as the new member for Farrer following the by-election. He is the first elected One Nation candidate to be elected at an election to the House of Representatives.

The Senate

There are 76 Senators in the Australian Senate. Six senate seats from each state and two senate seats from each of the territories, totalling 40 senate seats, are elected at each election. Senators from the states are elected for a term of 6 years. Senators from the territories are elected for a term of 3 years.

- On 02 June 2025, Senator Dorinda Cox, Senator for Western Australia, announced that she had left the Australian Greens to join the Australian Labor Party.
- On 03 May 2026, Senator Tammy Tyrrell, Senator for Tasmania, announced that she is joining the Australian Labor Party. Senator Tyrrell was previously an Independent.
